### CTI-CFF Implementation Road Map and Calendar 2012

#### **Background**

At the CTI Leaders Summit in Manado in May 2009, the Regional Plan of Action for Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security was launched, listing 37 actions desired to be completed at the regional level. In May 2010, the first Regional-level Priority Actions and Coordination Workshop was conducted in Jakarta, with the purpose to prepare coordinated activities at the regional level that addressed the prioritized actions from the CTI Regional Plan of Action for 2010-2011. The workshop identified priority CTI regional activities for the five (5) goals in the RPOA and secondarily, activities for some cross-cutting themes; i.e. capacity building, governance, etc., towards implementing the CTI-CFF RPOA. For each activity or set of activities, the roles of the relevant CT6 member agencies and partners who will implement the activities, the source(s) of funds, the timing and location of the activities were also identified.

The 2nd Ministerial Meeting in Gizo laid the foundation to legally establish the CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat. The CTI Working Group on Coordination Mechanisms and Working Group on Financial Resources were tasked to develop suitable legal documents and financial mechanism to fully equip the permanent Regional Secretariat with enough authority and strength to implement its mandated roles and functions. The six governments agreed that definitive decision to legally establish a permanent CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat will be taken at the third Ministerial Meeting (MM3) scheduled in Indonesia in 2010. Unfortunately, due to a number of circumstances, the third Ministerial Meeting was postponed until 2011.

In the course of the 6th Senior Official Meeting (SOM6) in November 2010, the six governments recognized the need to have a systematic and well-paced approach in implementing priorities actions in 2011 and efficiently managing transition process of the interim Regional Secretariat into a fully operational permanent Regional Secretariat.

In this regard, at SOM6, governments adopted an activities roadmap for 2011 to accomplish the steps towards formal establishment. In the Roadmap, the Secretariat was asked to play a more proactive role in facilitating CT6 governments, including direct consultation and engagement with the countries.

In addition, as the Priority Actions got underway, there was a need for a centralized calendar and roadmap for planning of regional level activities. This ROADMAP is to serve these two purposes, organizing and defining the activities of the CTI at the regional level for establishment of the Regional Secretariat and conducting early actions.

**Decision:** Based on the above background information and presentations made by the TWGs on the status of their Priority Actions, the 7<sup>th</sup> Senior Officials Meeting adopts the following Activities Roadmap and Calendar for 2012 below.
