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

- Five (5) Technical Working Groups: Threatened Species, Marine Protected Area, Ecosystem Approach for Fisheries Management (EAFM), Seascape, and Climate Change Adaptation.
- Three (3) Governance Working Groups: Monitoring and Evaluation, Internal Resource Committee and Financial and Resource.
- Three Cross Cutting Initiatives: Women Leaders' Forum (WLF), Sustainable Business Forum (SBF), University Partnership (UP)

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Vision & Mission of CTI-CFF

The Coral Triangle Initiative on Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security (CTI-CFF) is a multilateral partnership of six countries (CT6), composed of Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, and Timor-Leste, working together to sustain the most extraordinary marine and coastal resources in the Coral Triangle Region by addressing crucial threats adversely impacting the climate, marine biodiversity, and food security.

Regional Plan of Action (RPOA) 2.0 - Guidelines for CTI-CFF Goals and Strategies


The 10-year Regional Plan of Action (RPOA 1.0) for the CTI-CFF was established in 2009, has driven significant achievements in the marine region across six member countries. RPOA 2.0, developed to guide regional collaboration from 2021 to 2030, aims to strengthen the outcomes of RPOA 1.0 in marine ecosystems, fisheries, and community well-being. RPOA 2.0 is supported by an Implementation Strategy, Communication Strategy, and Financial Strategy, which collectively ensure the achievement of its goals.

RPOA 2.0 Goals

This RPOA 2.0 has 2 goals, 3 objectives, 7 targets, 17 regional activities, 33 expected outcomes as well as 90 expected outputs which all its member countries actively contributed to.

RPOA 2.0 includes distinct goals for the implementation and integration of Gender Equality and Social Inclusion (GESI) policies.

National Plan of Action (NPOA)

After the approval and adoption of RPOA 2.0 at the 8th Ministerial Meeting of the CTI-CFF in November 2022, each country's National Coordination Committee (NCC) initiates the establishment of National Plans of Action (NPOA) in alignment with the overarching RPOA framework.

Monitoring and Evaluation

The Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) plan framework outlines the objectives, targets, and regional activities for RPOA 2.0. Assessment methods encompasses indicators, M&E targets,

data frequency, flow, verification means, and reporting. Several M&E activities lead by the M&E Working Group will be conducted to ensure achievements and effective implementation and will be reported to the Senior Officials in yearly basis.
