





## CTI-CFF Implementation Area

# Areas of Improvement

## Data Assessments

- A2.1.2 : Major gaps; need harmonized national → regional assessments.

## Conservation Plans

- (A2.1.1): Reporting quality uneven; financing and adoption lagging.

## IWT Enforcement

- A2.1.3 : TRIPOD strong start, but needs scaling and measurable outcomes.

## Migratory Corridors

- (A2.1.4): Identified but not yet managed regionally.

## Expert Pool

- (A2.1.5) : Network exists, but hub/platform still missing; CT6 ownership needs strengthening.
