Dear Distinguished Colleagues,

Let me first express my gratitude to all of you for your continued support and cooperation extended to the CTI-CFF Regional Secretariat to be able to fulfill its function.

I wish to refer you to the Invitations on Writeshops on the Draft RPOA 20 on 6 and 8 April 2022 (Ref. GWG/RS/3/22/82 dated 1 April 2022), where due to lack of quorum on 6 April, the online Writeshop was adjourned, and Member Countries were requested to provide their inputs on the latest Draft RPOA 2.0 document. Unfortunately, on 8 April the Writeshop was also postponed due to lack of quorum.

Therefore, through the email thread of GWG/RS/3/22/82 dated 8 April 2022, RS enquired the availability for new date, that were 12 and 13 April 2022. Considering the poor response from Countries, RS had to postpone this too.

The Regional Secretariat thanked the Member Countries who have provided their inputs on the text of the Draft RPOA 2.0 and kindly request Countries that had not done so to provide their inputs, before or by 31 May 2022.

In lights of the urgency to complete RPOA 2.0 documents, and to achieve an efficient and effective discussion, the Writeshop on 7-8 June 2022 is now proposed to be conducted *In-Situ*. In this meeting, discussion will only be made on those inputs RS received from Countries by the deadline above. Countries are no longer allowed to provide inputs/new inputs during the Writeshop as RS had already circulated the request for inputs as mentioned above.
